

This is the start of a word cloud using some of the words from today's Gospel.


Can you use these words, and any more that you heard today, to fill in the word cloud and make it bigger?


St George

St George is the patron saint of England although it is thought that he came from what is now Turkey and he was never in this country.

His emblem is the red cross which King Richard the Lion Heart adopted as his own emblem. The king's soldiers would wear this emblem so that they were not mistaken for the enemy.

The red cross of St George has become England's flag and is one part of Great Britain's Union Flag. Do you know the other parts of the Flag? England's emblem is the red rose.

St George is also the patron saint of scouts and guides.
