A Message from Fr Mark...

**Lord Teach Us to Pray
Forgive Us Our Trespasses as We
Forgive Those Who Trespass Against Us**

God longs to heal the wounds in our hearts and souls that have been caused not only by our own sins, but also those that have been caused by the sins of others. When our hearts get hurt and broken, we have a Father who longs to heal us and to bring us hope and to mend us up again.

Forgiveness is essential to our inner healing and freedom. We need Divine Mercy, the Healing Love of God. This is not just us asking God to forgive us (of course, that's essential and that's why our Penitential Rite at Mass and the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Reconciliation, as well as our own frequent pleas for mercy, are so important). We are also asking God's grace to help us forgive others.

Forgiveness is a BIG topic. I'm going to share 5 different lies about forgiveness, things that the enemy wants us to believe about forgiveness. A lot of people who don't forgive choose not to because they don't understand what forgiveness is or because they've bought into various lies about forgiveness. It's not an exhaustive list but I'm hoping this will help you better to understand and seek forgiveness.

5 Lies of Unforgiveness

Forgiveness means lowering my defences so that I will be hurt again

This lie tries to convince me that if I forgive then I'm going to be hurt again. But this is a lie. While forgiveness does involve the vulnerability of sometimes feeling the pain, forgiveness does not mean putting yourself in the position to be hurt by someone else again.

Forgiveness is a release of someone from the debt owed to you or someone that you love.

Forgiveness means condoning what happened

This lie says, "If I forgive them, then they're just going to get away with it. They can pretend it was OK and therefore they can go and do it again". But in truth, forgiveness presupposes that what they did is wrong.

Forgiveness means I need to be reconciled with the offender

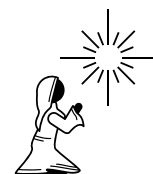
Forgiveness is not two-sided. Your forgiveness does not require the other person to do anything and it does not require reconciliation or friendship. Trust needs to be earned. There might be someone that is not safe to be reconciled with, or someone that doesn't want to be reconciled with us.

I need to feel like forgiving in order to forgive

Of course, if you've been really hurt, and you have a false understanding what forgiveness is, then it's unlikely you're going to feel like forgiving. The most important part about forgiveness, and the part that's liberating for us, is to recognise that forgiveness is a decision of the will. It's not about feeling at all.

Forgiveness presupposes I must have hard feelings toward the one who hurt me

We can sometimes minimise the need to forgive because we don't recognise how much we've been hurt. Sometimes we simply need to say to someone who's been hurt, "What happened to you was wrong. That should never have happened to you". It's not that we're trying to judge the person that did it or get them to hate the person. But helping someone to forgive often means helping them to discover that this particular thing that happened to them was wrong in the first place.
