Blessed are you who believe in the promise of the Lord - May Christ be born in you

A Message from Fr Mark...

Sue Monk Kidd in her book, 'From When the Heart Waits', writes about her visit to a monastery around Christmas time many years ago. She passed a monk walking outside the church and said to him, "Merry Christmas." And the monk replied, "May Christ be born in you."

At the time, she thought that this was a very peculiar greeting. But she never forgot it. And, with time, she came to realise the power of that simple greeting: "May Christ be born in you."

In today's Gospel, we listen to a fragment of the Visitation, when Mary arrives at the house of her cousin Elizabeth. Mary has hurried there after the conversation with the Archangel Gabriel, in which she offers her wholehearted 'yes' to God. She will indeed be the mother of Jesus, God's only begotten Son. Maybe her haste has been to care for and support her elderly relative, who is also pregnant, despite her age. Or maybe it's been to get away from Nazareth and the prying eyes of neighbours who will soon discover that Mary is with child. Or maybe both...

In any case, Elizabeth greets her with these words:

'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

Mary had believed in the promise of the Lord that she would miraculously give birth to a son and this promise of God was indeed fulfilled. Elizabeth recognised the truth of this without Mary having to say a word, for she was filled with the Holy Spirit herself. Moreover, John the Baptist, the child within her womb, leapt for joy at the arrival of Jesus.

[Incidentally, Pope Benedict XVI called this the "first Eucharistic procession" as Mary carried Christ into the world. She was a living tabernacle. And so it is that her cousin became the first to experience Eucharistic adoration, and to share in the first Benediction, offering her own "Divine Praises": "Blessed are you," she says to Mary. "Blessed is the fruit of your womb. Blessed are you who believed." Three times, she speaks the word "Blessed."]



The Proclamation of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

At the start of Christmas Mass in the Night at St Peter's, Deacon Martin will announce the birth of Jesus, with a solemn proclamation. **(Take a look at the word sheet for Mass in the Night, to see the words of the proclamation).**

The Roman Missal says "The announcement of the Nativity of the Lord from the Roman Martyrology draws upon Sacred Scripture to declare in a formal way the birth of Christ. **It begins with creation and relates the birth of the Lord to the major events and personages of sacred and secular history.**" And so, we hear of the creation of mankind, the Flood, of Abraham, Moses and David - but also the 194th Olympiad, the foundation of the city of Rome, and the 42nd year of the reign of Caesar Octavian Augustus. In doing so, the proclamation reinforces the central truth of the Incarnation: **that Jesus Christ is truly divine and truly human, born at a specific point in human history.**

We too have been born into a specific point in human history, just like Jesus; will we use the time given to us, to love Him, serve Him, and proclaim Him to all people?

As Mary believed the promise of the Lord, so Jesus the Christ was born in her. There's an invitation to you today, as we approach this beautiful and powerful feast of Christmas, to believe more fully in the promises of the Lord, that they might be fulfilled, and that Jesus Christ might be born in you. What might be that promise that God is making to you?

- "I am with you always, even to the end of time"?
- "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life"?
- "I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me"?
- "Whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do"?
- "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses"?
- "Come to me all you who labour and are overburdened and I will give you rest"?
- "Hope does not disappoint because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us"?
- "My peace I give you, a peace which the world cannot give is my gift to you"?

Or some other promise..?

"When Christ dwells within, there is peace." Pope St. John Paul II, in his Angelus message of December 19, 1999, explained that Christmas is not simply the remembrance of the Event that took place about 2000 years ago when, according to the Gospel, the power of God took on the frailty of a baby. It is really about a living reality that is repeated every year in the hearts of believers.

The mystery of the Holy Night, which historically happened two thousand years ago, must be lived as a spiritual event in the 'today' of the Liturgy," the Pope clarified. "The Word who found a dwelling in Mary's womb comes to knock on the heart of every person . . ."

The promises of the Lord are being fulfilled even today. Blessed are you if you believe!

May the Lord bring blessings upon you and your loved ones this Christmas, filling you with joyful hope and a peace which the world cannot give. And, may Christ be born in you!

Centenary Preparations - St Peter's Church - Update

As a Parish we have received permission for Building Works to proceed and we are in the final stages of appointing a contractor to carry out what we are referring to as "The Dirty Work" which will involve repairs to

- cracks in internal walls
- loose parquet floor and quarry tiles
- rusting ferramenta in stone window frames
- Installation of french drain to reduce damp in narthex walls.



To facilitate this work, it is regrettable that we will need to close St. Peter's on weekdays, but we will re-open allowing for us to celebrate the Sunday Masses. We are currently finalising preparations for the works and anticipate that this will **start in early January 2025 and run through until Holy Week**. Once we have more definite dates we will share then with you. During this time, the intention is to move Weekday Masses and Prayers to the Milner Hall. We will also need to find, on occasion, alternative arrangements for funerals. We are looking at various options and will consider each funeral on a case by case basis, trying to support the needs of the deceased and their family and loved ones as best we can. Admissions Consultation - St Peter's School for 2026 -27

In recognition of the national decrease in birth rate, and for the foreseeable future, the Governors have decided to adjust their pupil admission number (PAN) for entry in September 2026 from 60 to 45 children. This is the same number that St Peter's School had admitted each year until the earlier 'bulge' in birth rates, so our proposal is a return to the previous successful arrangements. Over time, year groups will be merged to create a new class structure which will allow the Governors to address the budget constraints which result from the fall in numbers of children in school. As the Admissions authority for the School, Governors are obliged to consult on this change for a period of 6 weeks, ending on 21st January 2025.

Laudato Si Corner

Pilgrims of Hope and Climate Justice - On the 12 December, Pope Francis warned that climate change, wars and unequal treatment of migrants amongst other issues 'represent a threat to the existence of humanity as a whole'. But as he announced the **Jubilee Year the Pope said: 'In the realization that all of us are pilgrims on this earth**, which the Lord has charged us to till and keep (cf. Gen 2:15), may we never fail, in the course of our sojourn, to contemplate the beauty of creation and care for our common home. It is my hope that the coming Jubilee Year will be celebrated and experienced with this intention too. Growing numbers of men and women, including many young people and children, have come to realize that **care for creation is an essential expression of our faith in God** and our obedience to his will.' NEW PRAYER GROUP: MOTHERS' PRAYERS (January to Easter)

To help launch the Year of Hope, **we are starting a Mothers Prayers group** in the parish for mothers who wish to pray together for their children and grandchildren, in a relaxed and informal setting, closing each meeting with chats and refreshments. Here is what Isabelle who will be leading the group says, *"I joined a Mothers Prayers when my children were toddlers (they have now finished university) and I made lifelong friends that I still meet regularly. When I joined, I met a group of mothers praying weekly for their children, family, and any intentions close to their hearts. We got to know each other intimately very quickly because people tend to pray about very joyous or very difficult situations and the group was a safe place where one could pray without being judged or offered any unwanted advice. Whatever is said during prayers is confidential and not spoken about even within the group unless the person it relates to brings it up afterwards themselves; this is a fundamental principle of Mothers Prayers. We then close the meeting with chats and refreshments"*.
