FATHER MARK WRITES: LET THE RIVER FLOW: BECOMING CHANNELS OF HEALING

As we journey together toward the Centenary of St Peter's, we're invited to pause and reflect—not just on our history, but on our identity. Who are we, really? And why do we do things the way we do? Over the past few weeks, we've explored our love for Scripture, our commitment to simplicity, and our calling to be saints—each of us, no matter our story, are welcomed into a parish that strives to be *A Place for All*.

This week, we turn to the theme of healing. And we begin with a striking image from Ezekiel: a river flowing from the temple, deepening as it moves, bringing life to barren lands—even to the salty, lifeless Dead Sea. This river transforms everything it touches. Trees bear fruit every month. Waters become fresh. Leaves become medicine. It's a vision of divine abundance, of healing flowing from the heart of worship.

Ezekiel's river is more than a poetic image—it's a theological portrait of the Church. The temple, once the dwelling place of God, is now fulfilled in Jesus Christ, the new and living Temple. "Destroy this temple," He said, "and in three days I will raise it up." He was speaking of His body. In Jesus, we encounter the fullness of God's presence, the source of forgiveness, the centre of worship, and the ultimate sacrifice of love.

And now, through the Holy Spirit, that presence dwells in us. We are the living stones, the spiritual house, the holy temple. The sacraments—especially Baptism and the Eucharist—are the river that flows from Christ's pierced side, bringing grace, healing, and renewal to a thirsty world. Pope Benedict XVI called this "the fountain" of life. Pope Francis speaks of "a wealth of life and salvation" flowing from the temple.

But this isn't just theology—it's mission. Ezekiel's river flows into a desert. It heals the Dead Sea. And so must we. Who are the spiritually thirsty among us? The lonely, the disconnected, the migrant seeking safety, the one numbed by endless doomscrolling, the person battling mental health struggles or searching for meaning. These are the places where the river must flow.

And healing isn't just for others—it's for us too. Many of us carry wounds: things said or done, regrets, fears, losses. Hurt people hurt people. But healed people? Healed people become channels of healing for others.

Already, we see little fountains of grace springing up across our parish, like at a "splash park" or "play fountain". A parent blessing their child at bedtime; someone stepping into church and encountering peace in the Eucharist; a colleague offering prayer; a friend having the courage to ask for healing. These are the trickles. But what if they became tributaries? What if they merged into a mighty river?

To do that, we need to be intentional. We need to create a culture where it's normal to pray for one another, to bless and be blessed, to risk praying for those around us. Like the paralysed man lowered through the roof, we don't need to do much—just be humble and open. And healing will come.

Because we are the Church. We are the winning team—not because of anything we've done, but because Jesus is the Healer, the Saviour, the Victor. Everything we do—our giving, serving, small groups, outreach, sacraments—is a celebration of that victory. But more than celebration, we are called to reflect it. To be ambassadors of healing, wholeness, and resurrection.

So let the Light shine. Let the Water flow. Let us become channels of God's immense healing—here, now, in Winchester, Alresford, Stockbridge and beyond.

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica - This Sunday, 9th November – replacing the 32nd Sunday of the Year - we keep the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the oldest and most important of the four major basilicas in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome, and is the official seat of the Holy Father as the Bishop of Rome (not St. Peter's Basilica as many mistakenly think). In ancient times, this was the church in the city where everyone was baptised. It is the oldest church in the Western world, built in the time of Constantine and consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324.



This feast became a universal celebration in honour of the ecclesiastical mother church, called "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput). It then became a feast kept throughout the Church as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter, and a day to pray for the Pope's intentions.

JiSung Compline – First Fridays at St Peter's: Step into stillness with Latin Sung Compline, the Church's Night Prayer, on Friday 7th November at 9.00pm in St Peter's Church. In just 20 minutes, this simple, contemplative liturgy brings a peaceful close to the day. No need to sing - simply come and pray. If you'd like to try Gregorian Chant, join the rehearsal at 8.00pm beforehand. From now on, Sung Compline will be held on the first Friday of every month - a new rhythm of prayer, beauty and peace at the heart of our parish.

Sunday 9th November - Remembrance Sunday

This Sunday is **Remembrance Sunday**, when we honour the service and sacrifice of British and Commonwealth military and civilian personnel in the World Wars and in conflicts since. It is observed on the Sunday closest to Armistice Day (11th November), marking the end of the First World War in 1918. At 11am, a two-minute silence is held across the nation. Ceremonies take place at war memorials in towns and villages, attended by civic leaders, veterans, armed forces personnel, cadet groups, and youth organisations.

The red poppy, which grew on the battlefields of Flanders, remains a powerful symbol of remembrance.

November - Month of Prayer for the Faithful Departed - a sacred time to remember and pray for all who have gone before us. In the Catholic tradition, November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, beginning with All Saints' Day (2nd Nov) and All Souls' Day (3rd Nov). It's a time to live out the beautiful truth of the Communion of Saints - that our prayers, sacrifices, and acts of love can help the faithful departed reach the fullness of Heaven.

→ Why It Matters

Our prayers are powerful. The souls in purgatory cannot pray for themselves -they rely on us. Every Mass offered, every prayer whispered, every act of charity brings hope and mercy.

A How You Can Take Part

- Attend Mass and offer it for loved ones who have died.
- Visit cemeteries and pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence can be gained during the first eight days of November by doing this.
- Pray the Eternal Rest prayer:
- "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen."

- Sunday 9th November at 12:30pm St James' Cemetery
- Sunday 16th November at 3:00pm Morn Hill.
