FATHER MARK WRITES: LET THERE BE LIGHT THIS CHRISTMAS

God has something to say to you this Christmas: **Let There Be Light!**

As the days grow shorter and nights longer, we feel it - our deep need and longing for light. Light is life. Without it, nothing grows, nothing thrives. So, we hang lights on trees and brighten our streets. It's more than decoration; it's a longing as old as humanity. Scripture begins with God's first words, which bring light into the darkness:

"God said, 'Let there be light' and there was light. And God saw the light was good." (Genesis 1:3)

Life needs light. Without light, there is no life.

Centuries later, Isaiah the prophet spoke to a people in darkness - they were divided, attacked, despairing - and he offered hope:

"The people who have been walking in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shown." (Isaiah 9:2)

We know what it feels like to walk in darkness: illness, grief, broken relationships, financial strain, fear, guilt. Darkness isn't just out there; it's in here, our hearts. But God does not want you to live in the darkness of discouragement or doubt. He wants you to experience the joy that comes from light.

Where does that light come from? Not from ourselves, but as a gift:

"For a child is born to us, a son is given us... They name him Wonder-Counsellor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:5).

Jesus later says:

"I am the light of the world." (John 8:12)

He offers wisdom when we're confused, strength when we're weak, peace when we're anxious. He doesn't promise to remove every shadow, but to light the next step.

So tonight, why not begin that journey? Simply pray:

"Lord, be a light for my feet. Show me the way."
