FATHER MARK WRITES: LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Wow! What an incredible few days we've had, with hundreds of people pouring into St. Peter's Church for the beginning of our centenary celebrations. Let us thank God for all the many ways He has blessed us and has blessed others through us this week. It has been truly beautiful to witness the church building looking so amazing, and the music sounding so moving, and the sense of God's presence being so tangible, and the countless ways in which so many of you have offered yourself to serve and welcome and care for and guide our countless guests. Thank you!

In today's Gospel, Jesus says to those who are listening: **"You are the light of the world"**.

Fr Gustavo Gutierrez, the 'godfather' of liberation theology comments on this passage:

"Jesus is the true light, a light for those who sit in darkness (Mt 4:16), a light that will break forth "like the dawn" (Isa 58:8), light because it reveals the Lord in his words and deeds. The disciples are witnesses of the light insofar as through them we can see some of the Father's goodness revealed in the Son. Naturally that light must be visible, accessible to everyone rather than hidden by veils and human fears (Mt 5:15). The grace of being a disciple is not for our private use; it has to be communicated. It must shine despite the weakness of the bearers. Truth should never be hidden because those to whom it is destined have an urgent and boundless need of it..."

Matthew tells us that the light will be manifested in "good works" (5:16). Isaiah describes them in terms similar to those used by Jesus (in Mt 25), in precise deeds with very concrete neighbours: sharing bread, providing housing, clothing the naked. If we do that, we will not be hiding ourselves "from our own kin" (Isa 58:7), as the prophet beautifully writes. If we do that, we will break the darkness, and "light will rise in the darkness" (Isa 58:10).

These "good" works are a substantial part of the mission: they are the revelation of another's message. They do not refer back to those who carry them out as if they were seeking personal glory. Instead in these good works, we see and give glory to the Father of all goodness (Mt 5:16). In the sermon on the mount we find constant references to the Father: the works, our works provide a glimpse of the Father's goodness and love for humankind."

Let us pray that many are able to catch a glimpse of the Father's goodness and love for humankind, as we let His light shine in and through us!

I know! It's had to believe that Lent will begin in less than 2 weeks' time! As always, we have prepared a wonderful selection of opportunities for you to grow in your relationship with our Heavenly Father.

This Lent, I'd like to invite our whole parish to step into a gentle but powerful journey of healing. Scripture calls to us, "Return to me with all your heart" (Joel 2:12), and this year we're taking those words seriously — not as a burden, but as an invitation to wholeness.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, we'll be uniting around a simple parish-wide campaign called **Return and Be Healed**. Each Sunday we'll explore how Jesus meets us in our wounds; during the week we'll share short daily reflections; and small groups will gather to walk through the Healing the Whole Person series together.

PARKING & BUILDING WORKS - REREDOS

Important Notice About Parking at Winton House: We would like to reiterate our message regarding parking at Winton House, as this has become an important issue.

Parishioners who choose to park in the Winton House car park do so entirely at their own risk. We have been informed that several parishioners have already received parking fines for using this car park without permission.

As a parish, we have made every effort to seek approval. We initially contacted the landlord, and more recently spoke directly with two of the tenants to ask whether weekend parking might be allowed. Unfortunately, both tenants have politely declined our request, explaining that the parking spaces are needed for their employees, who may require access at any time. They also advised us that they have received similar requests from other tenants based at the rear of the building. Because permission has not been granted, parking at Winton House is not authorised, and continuing to park there could result in a Parking Penalty Notice of £70.

We therefore strongly ask parishioners to make alternative parking arrangements and to avoid using the Winton House car park altogether. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping us maintain good relationships with our neighbours. Alternative parking is available please [click here](#) for more information.

Looking Ahead: Upcoming Works in the Church: Over the coming weeks, some important care and cleaning work will be taking place in the church, helping us look after our beautiful building for the future. The work is due to begin on **Monday 9 February** and is expected to **finish by Friday 27 March**, just in time for Holy Week. We are pleased to share that we have now received confirmation and approval for the cleaning of the reredos, which is an exciting step forward.

To allow the scaffolders safe and easy access, the church will need to be **closed from Monday to Wednesday next week**. During this time, scaffolding will be carefully built in front of the reredos and will then be **fully covered by a protective curtain**.

While the scaffolding is in place, we kindly ask everyone **not to go near it**, so that the work can be carried out safely. For the duration of the works, the **Blessed Sacrament (Tabernacle)** will be respectfully moved and kept safely elsewhere.

From **Monday to Friday**, most services will take place in the **Lady Chapel**, while weekend services will return to the **Sanctuary** as usual. Please keep an eye on the weekly newsletter for the latest information on where services will be held.
