Today we are given St Peter as an icon to meditate with as we continue to ask 'which soil am I'?

St Peter was courageous in the boat, but fearful in the water. As soon as he felt the force of the wind, he began to sink.

What kind of soil is St Peter here? **He jumped up at once**, and when he felt the wind, he gave up and began to sink.

Jesus said that it is the seed that falls in the patches of rock that has no depth, **spring up at once and then does not last**. He gives up for lack of depth'.

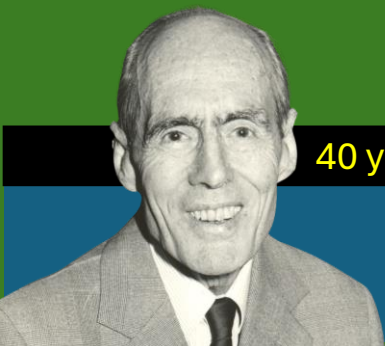

Family learning from the Catechism:
Jesus continues to speak about the eternal fires this weekend. Here is what the Catechism has to say about Hell:

1033 We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against him, against our neighbour or against ourselves: "He who does not love remains in death. Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him." Our Lord warns us that we shall be separated from him if we fail to meet the serious needs of the poor and the little ones who are his brethren. To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him for ever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called "hell."

1034 Jesus often speaks of "Gehenna" of "the unquenchable fire" reserved for those who to the end of their lives refuse to believe and be converted, where both soul and body can be lost. Jesus solemnly proclaims that he "will send his angels, and they will gather . . . all evil doers, and throw them into the furnace of fire," and that he will pronounce the condemnation: "Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire!"

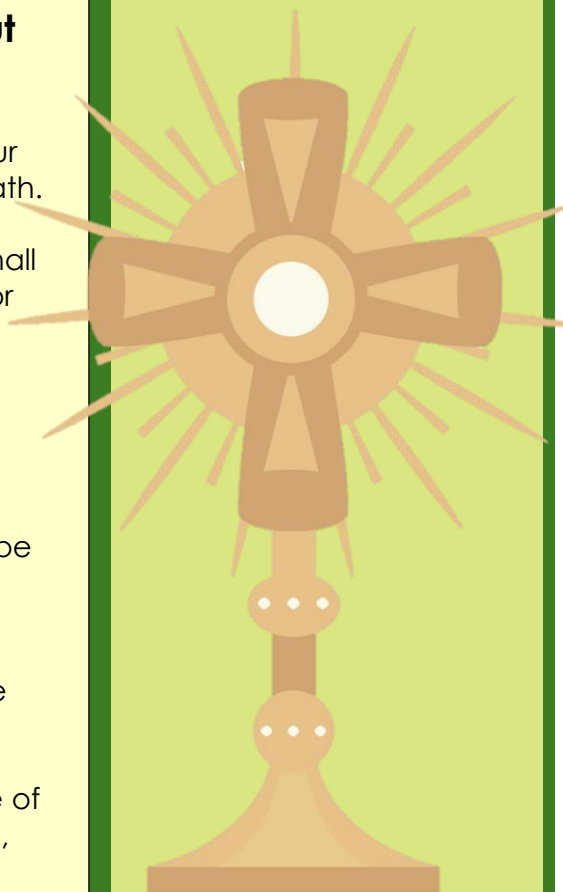
1035 The teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity. Immediately after death the souls of those who die in a state of mortal sin descend into hell, where they suffer the punishments of hell, "eternal fire."
